The Legislative Research Assistant Analyst is assigned to one or more standing committees to facilitate the committee process and assist state senators under the supervision of the Research Staff Director.

- -Testify and answer questions in committee hearings.
- -Track legislation.
- -Research issues as requested by legislators and staff.
- -Disseminate information to the public.
- -Draft summaries of legislative material.

- -Write clearly and concisely.
- -Have excellent research, organization, time management, writing and public speaking skills.
